Books

- Find books by searching the Library's catalog, HOMER <<http://homerweb.lib.uconn.edu>>.
 - Start with a Subject search. If you don't find anything, then try Keyword.
- Most books of interest will be in the **QD** (Chemistry) and **TP** (Chemical Engineering) sections.
 - Second Floor, North side of the Library (General and Oversized books).
 - First Floor (Reference books).
 - Plaza Level (Reserve books)
- Theses are on Level A (the sub-basement)
- If the Library doesn't own the book you want you can:
 - Request a copy through Inter-Library Loan <<http://www.lib.uconn.edu/online/services/ill/>>
 - Request that the Library purchase a copy <<http://www.lib.uconn.edu/print/services/RequestForPurchase/>>
- Grad students can borrow books for up to 180 days. Books can be renewed online through HOMER or by calling the Circulation desk (486-2518).

Journals

- Locate articles by searching an online index or database <<http://rdl.lib.uconn.edu/>>
 - SciFinder Scholar – Chemical Abstracts Online (1967-Current) (requires special software)
 - Compendex & INSPEC(1969- Current) – Index to all engineering fields and the physics of materials.
- Check in HOMER using a Journal Title search to see if the Library owns the journal in print or electronic form. Journals are on the Third Floor (1960 to the present) or Level A (prior to 1960). Current (unbound) journals are on the Third Floor, North Side in their own section. The journals are in exact alphabetical order by title (exception: if there is a Shelving Title listed in HOMER, use that instead).
- Most engineering journals that the Library has access to online should be in HOMER, but you can also check the Library's electronic journal locator <<http://www.lib.uconn.edu/online/ejournals/>>.
- If the Library doesn't have access to the journal, you can request the article through Document Delivery <<http://www.lib.uconn.edu/online/services/ill/>>. Most requests are filled within 2-5 business days and there is no charge to you. Articles are delivered online whenever possible.

Patents and Standards

- Patent resources can be found at <<http://www.lib.uconn.edu/online/research/bysubject/engrpatu.htm>>. Many patents are freely available from the US or European patent offices or other Internet resources. You can also request patents through Document Delivery.
- The Library doesn't collect standards except for ASTM standards. You can request other standards through Document delivery.
