

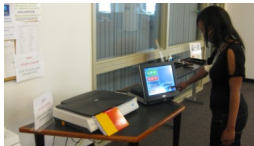

### New course reserve

The course reserve system in HuskyCT will feature several new functions as it transitions to a different software provider this summer. The new system allows faculty to set reserve periods for individual items; check the status of items requested; and see the number of times reserve materials were accessed. ### Free book scanning

The library now has a book scanner that enables converting from hard copy text and photos to PDF, Word, JPEG and HTML formats — free of charge. The scanner is located on the first floor of the library next to the photocopier.

### Census data workshop

Faculty interested in accessing 2010 U.S. Census data online are encouraged to attend a

workshop on the new *American Factfinder* database hosted by the Connecticut State Data Center. The workshop will be conducted by UConn Storrs librarians Steve Batt and Michael Howser. ### Now available for loan

Beginning this summer a variety of digital learning tools will be available for use in the library. 2 Dell laptops, 3 portable DVD players, 8 headphones, 2 graphing calculators and 4 scientific calculators may be borrowed by presenting a UConn ID card at the library services desk. This fall the library will add 2 Mac adapters, for use in the collaboration rooms, to its equipment.



### Links menu

The “UConn Links” menu within the libraries’ online databases (allowing users to access full-text links or order an item through interlibrary loan) will be getting a new look as the libraries transition to a different interface. Changes will be implemented by July 1.

### Toolbars for research

Downloadable toolbars are available to students and faculty for easy access to library resources. The toolbars may be applied to online browsers (Internet Explorer, Firefox, etc.) and modified for specific courses. If you are interested in creating a customized toolbar, contact a UConn Stamford librarian.

### RefWorks —RefShare
